AI5P TRAVELS NORFOLK ISLAND

After yet another stopover in Auckland, I flew to Norfolk Island on October 22nd. Air New Zealand again tagged me overweight (\$\$) even though the airplane was about 20 percent full. I soon had my rental car which came with the cottage. I had learned of the cottage through my friend Nigel, G3TXF, and it has been the site of a number of radio operations. Norfolk Island is only 13 square miles so you can't get lost! However, as I learned, if there is road work blocking

the road you just sit and wait! It is interesting to know the cattle (many residents have a few head which are butchered for personal use) have the right of way on the roads!

Norfolk is about 1 and 1/2 hour flight from Auckland. Isolated in the South Pacific, it is an Australian External Territory. It was discovered by Captain James Cook in 1774 and named for the Duchess of Norfolk. Then politically a part of New South Wales, Norfolk was twice (1788-1814 and 1825-1855) used as a penal colony.

The second attempt resulted in a prison of infamy and dread and it was closed in 1855. It is said prisoners would murder their guards in order to "escape" by being hanged. In 1856, Norfolk was resettled by Pitcairn Islanders, descendants of the HMAV Bounty mutineers and their Tahitian companions. About 40 percent of today's islanders can trace their ancestry to the Bounty mutineers.

Norfolk is the only place in Australia that celebrates Thanksgiving - a tradition started by American whalers in the 19th century. Home of the magnificent Norfolk Island pine tree and the Norfolk language (a mixture of Tahitian and 18th century seafaring English), the island is truly unique!

I had plenty of space for my antennas and soon discovered that, again, 30 meters proved to be the band of choice. I did participate in the CQ WW on SSB but just made a few contacts. I also tried 80 meters CW with a homemade antenna from some speaker wire I brought. The total number of contacts was1838 with 236 (13%) on SSB and 1602 (87%) on CW. Band totals: 80 (35), 40 (258), 30 (1146) and 20 (399).

Unfortunately, 17 meters again was a total bust. Interesting stations worked included EA8TL, MD0CCE, UN2E, KP4TF, A31KK, CX7TT, P29VLR, V63DX, VK0BP, R1ANB, E51USA, SV1FXN/8, EA6UN, FM5CD, 4K9W, 5B4MF, and KH0/JR2DOL.

It was great fun to roam the island and take pictures. Although the island is small, there are about 100 miles of roads to find all sorts of interesting sights and historical locations. Lots of beautiful scenery to include unusual birds and plants.

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Most of the time I was there the weather was quite nice. The main "town" has the interesting name of Burnt Pine. It has an interesting mix of stores and cafes (and one mall!).

It appears Norfolk is a favorite vacation spot of older Australians - certainly no hot night spots! I did see (from a distance) the QTH of Jim Smith, VK9NS, with a beam and four-square antenna.

Norfolk turned out to be one of my favorite places! Truly unique in many ways! As I departed on October 31st back to New Zealand for the final stop on this year's trip, I was really happy I had decided to go to Norfolk. It turned out to be quite a nice surprise!


Finally, I'd like to know how W5BPT enjoyed his lunch at McDonald's Wednesday (3/9)??







MAP TO N5ZM's
