

K7RA Solar update

03/09/2012

This has been quite a week for dramatic solar activity. The average daily sunspot number was up nearly 26 points to 69.4, while the average daily solar flux rose nearly 17 points to 121.9 for the period March 1-7. Sunspot numbers for March 1-7 were 24, 24, 52, 70, 105, 109 and 102, with a mean of 69.4. The

10.7 cm flux was 103.4, 108.2, 116.4, 120.1, 131.6, 138.1 and 135.7, with a mean of 121.9. The estimated planetary A indices were 14, 10, 8, 12, 8, 8 and 44, with a mean of 14.9. The estimated mid-latitude A indices were 12, 10, 8, 10, 11, 10 and 33, with a mean of 13.4.

Roatan Island, Honduras

I'm not sure at this point why I decided to go to Roatan. I had known of it for a number of years—my first cousin had actually lived there with her family for a number of years. I had not visited here but had stories of what a nice place it was. So I decided, against my already busted travel budget for 2011, to give it a go. I sought her advice and she recommended a travel agent and place to stay. I found out that most visitors are interested in diving and snorkeling. I decided on a 2 week "Divers" package which was all inclusive.

Turned out to be one of my better travel choices! On October 22nd I flew to Houston and caught the flight direct Roatan via Conti-Airlines. nental All went smoothly but I noticed a slight rain once on the ground. This would be the norm for the next five days! Except the slight rain turned into torrential rains and winds as a side effect to the island from Hurricane Rina! It was offseason for the sea-

son for the resort so the kindly upgraded me to an air conditioned cabin right on the water! This was an outstanding radio operating location-probably the best in all my travels for my 100 watts and wires. More about that later.

Roatan Island is 33 miles long, 4 miles wide, and lies 50 miles off the northern coast of Honduras. Administrative capital of the Bay Islands (IOTA NA-057), it was discovered by Columbus o his fourth voyage in 1502. Between 1550-1700, buccaneers found it a haven for safe harbor. English, French and Dutch pirates established settlements and raided Spanish ships transporting treasure

from the New World to Spain. Once part of Spain's vast empire in the New World, Honduras became an independent nation in 1821. Claimed by several nations, the Bay Islands were relinquished by Great Britain to Honduras in 1860. Today Roatan and the other Bay Islands are a favorite spot for scuba and snorkelers visiting the second largest barrier reef in the world.

I was surprised to see most of the people speak English and the road signs and advertising are mostly in English. went for a "dolphin encounter" - up close and personal! That was quite an experience!

With the poor weather and outstanding food at my resort, I stayed pretty close to the radio most of the time. I was using my Icom 706MKIIG and double bazooka antennas for 40, 30, 20, 17 and 15 and a homemade dipole for 12 and 10 meters. I had limited area for the wires so most of them went up (one at a time) in a sloping dipole configuration. I had over six thousand contacts, most-

ly on 10 and 12 meters, including almost 1200 JA contacts. Amazing! The 10 and 12 meter dipole was made with some speaker wire I brought!

Fortunately, the weather cleared the second week and I was able to enjoy some of the sights. I also enjoyed meeting Ray, HR9/WQ7R, for lunch a couple of times and to

visit his station. He had helped me sort out the license issues for my visit.

The trip back turned out to be a real nightmare. Let's just say I had multiple dealings with ticket agents, security checks, delayed flights (getting to sit on the tarmac at Roatan for an extra hour and one-half was lots of fun in a full aircraft!), customs in Houston, etc..... but overall I had a great time and would recommend visiting Roatan to all!




