# ADXA MEETING MINUTES

he 2nd quarter meeting of ADXA was held at the home of Ken Blevins on 16 March 2002. The meeting was called to order at 13:08

by President Dennis Schaefer after a playing of the Confederate National Anthem. The following guests were noted on the sign in sheet: Madge Kollatt KA5RSH and Janet Kendel KD5RKU.

Dennis welcomed everyone and thanked Ken & Pat Blevins for hosting this meeting. K5DV motioned that we dispense with reading of the minutes. N5ZM seconded and the motioned carried. The minutes are as printed in the Volume 10 Issue 1.

Under Health and Welfare. It was reported that K6ASB is in a nursing home. Larry Woolsey, W5LW, had his picture in the paper. It seems that he was rescued from his car following an accident in Rock Creek.

It was noted that the AD5XA repeater can be hit from Hot Springs Village and Pine Bluff, though weak.

N5ZM indicated that he was re-affirmed as ARRL DXCC Card Checker.

Dennis mentioned that HamCom (Dallas) is com-

ing up soon and that Tom Christian will be a speaker. It was also mentioned the ON4UN would also be there. Bill Priakos has asked for a \$200 donation. N5ZM suggested \$100; it was seconded by K5DV. The motion carried.

The Treasurer's report was given by Glenn, N5RN. The report was accepted as presented.

OLD BUSINESS: Dennis indicated that the BAT (Big Arkansas Tower) site that has been selected for the June meeting has limited facilities. He suggested that we find a park and do the eats and meeting there. Those interested in going to the BAT are welcome to convoy after the meeting. Dennis will be finding a park and let the group know the details. Dennis indicated that after the selling of the generator at the BAT, they have re-cooped most of their expenditures.

**NEW BUSINESS**: David Wolf, KC5KJE, of Edmond, Oklahoma has submitted his request for ADXA membership. He was nominated by Glenn, N5RN. He was accepted by the group as the latest member of ADXA.

### **Donations:**

The following donations were approved:

- As previously mentioned, \$100 was approved for HamCom
- VK9ML Mellish Reef—10 days—12 Apr. 6M, 28 and 24MHZ with CW Ops. AI5P motioned for \$50, W5BPT seconded. Motion carried.

Dennis began explaining the work that had been done to update the requirements for Honorary Life Member (HLM). Dave Jacques cleaned up the requirements for HLM and how the club wanted to recognize these individuals.

Dick Freeling, W5TIZ, was selected as our first Honorary Life Member. He was a founder of ADXA back in 1967 and in 1973 along with 3 others. Dick was blinded in WWII were he served as a First Lieutenant and comments on his accident by saying "I spent 1 day too long in Germany". He was awarded the Purple Heart, Silver and Bronze Stars. Dick started and ran his own business. Dick was licensed in 1951 and in 1956 earned his DXCC. Dennis met him on 3948 Mhz where Dennis said he learned a lot about amateur radio.

Rick Roderick also commented on the influence that "Dicky" had on him when he was 16 or 17 years old.

Dick was presented with a certificate noting his contribution to ADXA and his status of Honorary Life Member.

It was noted that Lou Dennis, W5SW, was updating the web page. W5BPT wanted the web page member picture updated.

Rick Roderick, K5UR, gave updates on several items including:

- The DXCC backlog is almost gone
- eQSL—expect some activity on this this year. It will likely have ties to the Logbook of the World
- He reminds us that our frequencies are under attack and he suggests that we pay attention to the FCC affairs.
- There are activities questioning the authority of the FCC to license Type 15 devices. They may not have the full authority to OK these devices.
- WARC 2003– 40 M—will shift down and 60M band to be established. Both look likely.
- WARC 2000—has 195 countries, 237 organizations, 300 observers, and 3 Ham Radio representatives via the IARU.
- WARC 2003—Little LEOs are likely to show up again. Don't think that VHF and UHF is all that is affected. Technology is being developed to use HF since both VHF and UHF are full.

K5DV motioned that the meeting adjourn. N5ZM seconded. The meeting was adjourned around 13:55

### If coming on Interstate 40:


