Words of Wisdom from the President

What's a DX'er?

When a fellow ham or friend asks you to explain "DXing" what do you tell them? More than likely, we would all answer with a little different slant on what DXing comprises and our own special areas of interest. When I was a newly minted Novice even New Jersey was DX! I remember listening to 20M with my Hallicrafters S20R and getting excited hearing Europeans for the first time. I even called my Elmer, K5APA (W5APA now), on the phone to give him a tip that 20M was open to Europe! It seemed important to me.

Obviously, many hams are drawn to DXing by the challenge of DXCC, Honor Roll, etc. These are the "Type A" DX'ers who enjoys the competition associated with DXing. We have a few of these in ADXA! Even those of us who are not fiercely competitive don't want to be among the first to retire during a "DX Stand-down". The competitive aspect drives us to improve our stations and brings the technical side into play. Modern DX stations have very specialized antennas and widgets to allow digging the rare ones out of the dirt. Studying the nature of high frequency propagation and developing the tools and skills necessary to predict the best time/conditions to hook up with the group going to S2 also provides a competitive advantage. Tapping into various information sources and maintaining a file of the schedules and frequencies of operators in needed countries is another aspect to being on the right frequency at the right time. Reliance on spotting nets isn't enough if you want to be among the first to make a Q before the DX station is spotted and the horde descends on the frequency.

One other aspect of DXing is the ability to get to know fellow DX'ers in other lands. Many long term friendships have been started by a DX QSO. We are naturally curious about what life is like in other countries. One of my more memorable QSOs was with John, VK4ATN, on 10M back in the 80's. John was a farmer who had a place in Lark Hill, near Brisbane. We talked for over an hour comparing notes on life on the farm in Arkansas and VK land.

- December—1st Saturday (5 December 2009). Location: AECC, Little Rock.





Card Checking

Comments from Members




MAP TO N5ZM's

When on I530 look for the Exit 30 (Highway 104). If you are coming from the north you will go under the overpass and be heading North.
