
#### **New Caledonia**

I arrived in New Caledonia via Auckland on Oct 1st, 2009. I had, unfortunately, not gotten any feedback from local hams from my e-mails. I found a great hotel on the north side of the main island (Grand Terre) which would help tremendously with the signal to stateside. Then I discovered it was about a 4-5 hour drive to the airport from there. With my early return flight, I didn't want to chance a problem. So I found another nice hotel about 45 minutes from the airport but on the south side of the island and not on the beach. Grand Terre is about 250 miles long, very mountainous, and averages 30 miles in width. So it's a very large place. I stayed at the Naina Park Hotel in the small town of La Foa and it couldn't have been

nicer with great hospitality and no problems for my wire antennas.

The great voyaging canoes of the Melanesian



people sailed into New Caledonia over 1500 years ago, but it was Captain James Cook who named the islands in memory of Scotland when he arrived in 1774. In 1853, Admiral Febvrier-Desponintes claimed the islands as French territory. Between 1864 and 1894 it served as a French penal colony. During World War II, New Caledonia served as a major Allied naval and air base. New Caledonia is now a self-governing territory of France and its economy centers on mining (nickel, copper, and cobalt), metallurgy, and tourism. It has 25 percent of the world's known nickel resources.

I was kept busy during the week with playing on the radio and sightseeing. Conditions weren't too good and even 20 meters wasn't so hot. Seventeen meters was a total bust. I ended with 1716 contacts with only 29 (2 %) on SSB and 1687 (98 %) on CW. There were 236 Q's on 40 meters (5 on SSB, 231 on CW), 1045 on 30 meters (CW), and 435 on 20 meters (24 on SSB, 411 on CW). Interesting stations worked included P29CW, 3D20CR, ZS3Y, GI3OQR, FM5CD, 5W0DW, R1ANC, ZS4U, BA7MG, TX5SPA, MD0CCE, and XW8B. Africans are particularly difficult from the Pacific. I've probably only worked a handful in all my trips the Pacific.

Sightseeing was extremely interesting with two trips to the capital Noumea ( 1 1/2 hr drive from hotel ) and visits there to the New Caledonia Museum, Noumea City Museum, Maritime Museum, city market,the American WWII Monument, Tjibaou Cultural Center, the fantastic Zoological and Botanical Garden and the remarkable Noumea

Aquarium. The aquarium was one of the best I've ever seen! The Maritime Museum turned into quite an event as there was an open house on a French destroyer tied up at the dock as well as a WWII-era dance inside the museum with great "swing" music and lots of local young people dressed in WWII-era clothing and uniforms and quite good at dancing the jitterbug!

Outside the Noumea area I also visited the Teremba Fort Penal Center (Circa 1874 and restored), hiked in the Park of the Large Ferns (where the QSL photo was taken), and viewed the remains of the "Pierced Rock" - where, unfortunately, erosion had caused the stone to crumble and fall into the ocean.

The visit to New Caledonia turned out to be much more interesting than I had originally thought it would be. A great start to my 2009 Pacific trip!

Hope to see you all at Earl's DX Palace on March 20<sup>th</sup>. Remember "Growing old is mandatory – growing up is optional".




# MAP TO N5ZM's
