A discussion about our funding DXpeditions was started and it was suggested that we look at other criteria for funding versus just where a DXpedition falls on the NA Most Wanted. It needs to reflect the needs of the membership which could be much different from the Most Wanted list. Many good points were made on what to consider. Ultimately members will be asked what they need for a ATNO and a database will be created to help use better identify what DXpeditions ADXA should support.

Joel asked those present to consider the question of do we need to have 4 meetings per year? Some voiced concerns about not having quarterly meetings. Some said much could be accomplished using the reflector and exchanging ideas that way. Some thought we should focus on having meetings at hamfests. Ohers mentioned that the June meetings are difficult because of conflicts with other meetings and contests. Weather become a concern if we move meetings into November or January. After some discussion it was decided that we should look at moving the annual meeting to November.



Meeting locations are more of an issue since we now have more members attending from all over the state. This years annual meeting will be in northwest Arkansas. Maybe considering rotating the location the annual meeting between central Arkansas and northwest Arkansas.

N5ZM mentioned that he received a 40 year pin from ARRL for being and active ARRL member for 40 years.

AI5P saw K5UR at Hamcom and Rick had a message for everyone "Your are all weenies". Everyone laughed.

AI5P mentioned that he will be travelling soon and will have his normal contest. Scoring will be 1 point per band per mode.

W5ZN shared that the Rebel DX group has indicated that Bouvet won't happen this year.

N5ZM made a motion that we adiourn. AI5P seconded and the motion carried. Meeting adjourned at approximately 1:10 PM.

## **Card Checking Tips**

DXCC Card Checking will be available at the meeting. To avoid problems with field checking your application be sure to follow the instructions on the ARRL website. Note that as of April 2, 2012, there are 2 ways of doing a paper card submission, online and traditional. You can no longer do a hybrid LoTW and paper card submission on a single application. It is absolutely necessary that you follow all the instructions and have all the paperwork properly filled out or I will not be able to check your cards.

If you use the preferred Online Electronic DXCC Application <a href="https://p1k.arrl.org/onlinedxcc/">https://p1k.arrl.org/onlinedxcc/</a>
for your paper cards it will be easier and cheaper for you. It will also go a lot faster at HQ when they get your paperwork since you already entered your card data in the ARRL system. With the online application you can enter the cards in any order. Just make sure to enter the QSOs on cards with multiple QSOs together to facilitate checking. The reason you don't have to sort by band then mode is because there is minimal data entry work at HQ when they get your field checked application.

You can also use the Traditional Application forms <a href="http://www.arrl.org/dxcc-forms">http://www.arrl.org/dxcc-forms</a> where you fill in and print the PDF forms for the application and record sheets. Make sure to follow those instructions. A traditional application will cost you roughly twice as much as the online application to cover data entry costs at HQ. With a traditional application you must sort cards by band then by mode with all the multiple QSO cards being listed last to facilitate data entry at ARRL HQ. If you use the traditional application make sure you include valid credit card info on the bottom of the PDF application form.

Whichever way you do it, follow those instructions and make sure the cards are properly sorted in the same order as your DXCC Record Sheet. Also make certain that all the QSL card information (call, date, band, mode, country) has been entered correctly on the record sheet.

### Bring the following:

- Cards sorted per your Record Sheet
- Printed copy of the signed and dated Application Sheet
- Printed copy of the DXCC Record Sheet
- Stamped envelope addressed to DXCC Desk, ARRL HQ, 225 Main Street, Newington, CT 06111, so I can mail your application to HQ.



## Adventures in Paradise—Tahiti

# Adventures in Paradise - Tahiti Rick Harris, FO/AI5P

Well, it didn't work out quite like the old James Michener's TV show *Adventures in Paradise*. But it had it's moments. After a "cattle car" class flight from LAX in an eight hour ordeal, my plane along with several other international flights arrived at Faa'a International Airport around 5 a.m. local time. Then you get to stand in a very long line awaiting your turn to process through immigration and then find your baggage. Finally you step outside in the dark to find large crowds and lots of cars trying to locate the recent arrivals.

### Welcome to Papeete!

Fortunately, my hostess located me quickly and we proceeded to her home in the suburbs. My host family was very nice and the room was excellent but I quickly discovered there wasn't much room for an antenna. I could only manage an inverted V on 20 meters using my extendable mast to up around 25 feet. But that was OK as the intent here was to activate the Fox and Hound mode of FT-8 with my first time as a "Fox" to get some experience. More about that later.

Papeete, the capital city of French Polynesia, is located on the island of Tahiti. French Polynesia is an overseas collectivity of France comprising of 118 geographically dispersed islands in the South Pacific stretching over 2,000 km. Divided into the Austral, Gambier, Marquesas, Society and Tuamotu archipelagos, they're known for their coral-fringed lagoons and over-the-water bungalow hotels. Island features include both white- and black-sand beaches, mountains, rugged backcountry, and towering waterfalls.

Papeete is a cosmopolitan city with a population over 130,000. It is a well-known cruise ship destination and the hub of ship and air travel to the other islands.

I was using my Icom 7300 which preformed flawlessly throughout the trip. With the very poor conditions (SFI 65-68), I knew that FT-8 and CW would be the best bet. The reason I didn't use SSB will be apparent later.

I spend as much time as possible operating and it was a challenge for sure. I could spot myself which I did often trying to get some action. I would listen on CW and not hear a single station many times. I would call CQ and spot myself but did not make even one CW contact from Tahiti. I expected to be at least able to work JA's and the West Coast! Not to be.

I did manage to sightsee in Papeete, take a ferry and tour over to the neighboring island of Moorea, and tour through the interior of Tahiti. Moorea has those over-the-water bungalows you see in the travel ads - just \$ 400 a night! After the first few days, I developed a severe cold and cough which convinced me to stay off SSB. Unfortunately, it only got worse as I departed Tahiti. The good news was it gave me more time to operate as I didn't feel like much else except watching the FT-8 screen.

I had been working with several folks to insure I understood the Fox and Hound mode of operation. I did have a couple of software issues which were brought under control after consulting with our club FT-8 expert, John, WB5BHS.

A total of 966 FT-8 contacts were made - including several with ADXA members.

Interesting DX contacts included: EW3EO, PJ2/DL4OCF, BG5GLV, RM0C, YF0TUR, 8J0YMA, BH2RMF, TG9AKH, SV1VS, FK8CE, VR2ZUZ, TF2MSN, and R2DR.

Departing Tahiti involved another long flight to Auckland, New Zealand, with a connecting flight to Sydney, Australia. Arrived there to find it raining and cold (winter-time down under) which certainly aggravated my condition. One overnight in Sydney found me the following morning awaiting check-in for my flight to Lord Howe Island - to be continued.


